The second largest suspension bridge in the United States. The bridge spans 1.7 miles.



Grand Canyon

Alamo

Old Faithful

Located in Yellowstone National Park, Old Faithful is the world's highest spouting geyser in the world. Old Faithful erupts every 65-92 minutes!



Niagara Falls

Shared by the US and Canada it is one of the most voluminous waterfalls in North America. The word "Niagara" is said to mean "Thunder of Waters"!



Kennedy Space Center

In July of 1962, the site was developed as the launch operations center for NASA. You can visit the site today to watch shuttle launches.



Mt. Rushmore

Mt. Rushmore was started in 1924 and finally finished in 1942. The sculpture was to honor the heroes of the west. The faces carved into Mt. Rushmore are, George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt.



Pikes Peak

The peak is the most easternmost high peak in the Rockies. It came to symbolize the gold rush of 1859. It is the most visited mountain in North America and second most visited in the world!
